Offer funding mechanisms to assist with cost of attaining credentials that certify an individual's career readiness and skills needed to be successful in the workplace


National Career Readiness Certification (NCRC)

Allows funding up to \$1,000* per calendar year, for certifications, trainings and other employment related costs (not covered under WIOA funding)
